The Anacostia Waterfront Initiative: A 10-Year Anniversary

Washington, D.C. - September 3, 2010 – Today, the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning & Economic Development announces a week of events celebrating the 10-year anniversary of the Anacostia Waterfront Initiative and summary of progress report entitled, "Anacostia Waterfront Initiative: 10 Years of Progress".

The Anacostia Waterfront Initiative (AWI) is a series of over \$2 billion of DC and federal government investments and \$7 billion of private investments being made to create a safe, clean Anacostia River where people can live, work, and play. Stretching 14 miles to the Southwest Waterfront, the Anacostia is drawing investments to its shores to create one of the largest economic, social and ecological transformations of any national urban waterfront ever.

"Ten years ago, on March 22, 2000, nineteen Federal and District agencies committed themselves to the unprecedented effort of restoring the Anacostia River and its waterfronts," said Mayor Fenty. "Now, in 2010, the rebirth of Washington as a sustainable, waterfront city is becoming a reality."
