As the rebirth of Washington as a sustainable waterfront city is becoming a reality, we are celebrating the tremendous strides across the AWI Framework Plan's 5 themes: (Destinations) Cultural Destinations of Distinct Character, (Environment) A Clean and Active River, (Parks) A Great Riverfront Park System, (Transportation) Breaking Down Barriers and Gaining Access, (Neighborhoods) Building Strong Waterfront Neighborhoods

Major milestones delivered in first 10 years

AWI Strategy & Planning

- Anacostia Waterfront Initiative Framework Plan to set the vision, context, history and goals for restoring the 2,800 acre waterfront zone
- Elevation of AWI with the "2010 Presidential Executive Order to Restore and Protect the Chesapeake Bay"
- AWI 10-year report highlighting the accomplishments and next steps to achieving a transformed Anacostia Waterfront

Destinations

- Nationals Ballpark \$611 million, LEED-certified, new home for the Washington Nationals
- Mandarin Hotel The District's newest five-star hotel, offering incredible views of the Tidal Basin and Southwest Waterfront
- The Yards Waterfront Park The 6-acre, world-class centerpiece for the Capitol Riverfront neighborhood with retail complex and marina

Environment

- 36% decrease in combined sewer overflow in the Anacostia River
- \$2.6 billion Long Term Control Plan to build miles of new underground wastewater tunnels
- A decrease in HALF of the dangerous chemicals that lead to acidification of water in the rivers
- 95 new acres of Wetlands planted along the banks of the Anacostia and through the Watershed

Parks

- Canal Park A 3-block long park celebrating the history of the Washington Canal with LEEDstandard amenities, restaurant and public fountain/winter ice rink
- Diamond Teague Park A memorial park offering floating wetlands, water-taxi service and an environmental pier for non-motor boats
- Kingman Island A natural sanctuary for marsh wildlife and wetlands that include an environmental learning lab complete with walking trails and an environmental learning center
- Marvin Gaye Park A transformed contiguous park space that celebrates one of the District's best know musicians near his childhood home

Transportation

- New construction for the \$300 million new 11th Street Bridge
- 13 miles of the Anacostia Riverwalk Trail

• Introduction of Water Taxi Service

Neighborhoods

- \$135 million renovated Mead Center for American Theater at Arena Stage
- 10 million square feet of new residential, office and retail space in the newly emerging Capitol Riverfront neighborhood
- 140% population growth (8,021 to 11,423)
- Capper Carrollsburg Phase I
