






Comments received on DEIS

Purpose and Need



Improve safety

The design and deteriorating condition of infrastructure in the corridor creates the need for improvements.

Improve multimodal mobility Roadway connections are missing and facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists are lacking.

Improve accessibility

Grade separations and intersection configurations limit access.

Support ongoing economic development

Development in the area will add thousands of jobs and create new residential neighborhoods.

- Coordination with key resource agencies and stakeholders






FEIS Preferred Alternative


- Modified DEIS Build Alternative 2

- Arched bascule bridge with opening span for navigation channel








East Section




Project Goals

Maximize accessibility and mobility during construction.













Anacostia Streetcar Project






Future Streetcar - Anacostia Line

Martin Luther King Jr. Avenue, Great Streets rendering


- Investment to transform Martin Luther King Jr. Avenue, SE, by improving the streetscape -sidewalks, lighting, paving, and street trees.
- Construction anticipated to begin by Spring 2010





Anacostia Riverwalk





A 16-mile biking/walking trail along both banks of the Anacostia River.

- Work will start in Spring 2009 on bridges and trails over railroad tracks east of the river in Anacostia Park and west of the river just north of the Sousa Bridge.
- Design is beginning in 2009 on Kenilworth-Parkside trail (Segment E).




Map Overview of Anacostia Riverwalk





- Construction 2010 to 2011






Pennsylvania Ave. & Potomac Ave. SE Circle
